

Outdoor4mi Education for, with and in Nature

The Outdoor4mi project will be implemented over two years and aims to capacitate early childhood educators to implement outdoor activities.

Seven European institutions are working in partnership to implement a common ideology, the possibility of innovative, enriching, and equitable education.

The main objective of the project is to promote environmental awareness through the implementation of outdoor activities with children aged between three and five, taking into account the uniqueness of each child, especially children with mobility impairments.

The consortium, after analyzing literature and interviewing kindergarten educators and parents from all countries covered by the project, will produce training courses and relevant materials for the implementation of outdoor education activities.

The creation of guidelines to assist teachers in implementing Outdoor Education, a teacher training program, and a set of tools for the implementation of these activities are expected.

By 2025, online and face-to-face training sessions will be organized in each participating country, and the materials produced will be available for free and in multiple languages on the project's official website.

The Outdoor4mi project will be co-financed by Erasmus+, the European Commission's financial instrument for Education and Training, with a support of €250,000.

VICINI ALLE PERSONE

The Outdoor4mi project aims to:

- Train a generation to respect nature and value its conservation from an early age;
- Increase the implementation of Outdoor Education activites;
- Develop inclusive Outdoor Education strategies for all students, especially those with reduced mobility;
- Enhance teachers' skills in implementing Outdoor Education activities, including through the use of digital tools;
- Improve communication between parents and educators, helping parents understand the value of the Outdoor Education approach;

The work has already begun!

Throughout the first phase of project implementation, a literature review was conducted regarding the implementation of activities outside the classroom, including effectiveness and expected outcomes.

This allowed us to understand significant improvements not only in terms of the relationship between children and nature but also social and emotional improvements among participants. Interviews were conducted with two focus groups of kindergarten educators and individual interviews with parents to understand the educational and family context of all partner countries in the project.

The first face-to-face meeting of the seven partners took place on June 20, 2024.

During this meeting, we were able to get to know the partners better and learn about all the work they have done in the field of environmental education. With the warm welcome from CO&SO and SPAZIO, we clarified the responsibilities and tasks of each partner, as well as established the next steps for implementing the Outdoor4mi project.
